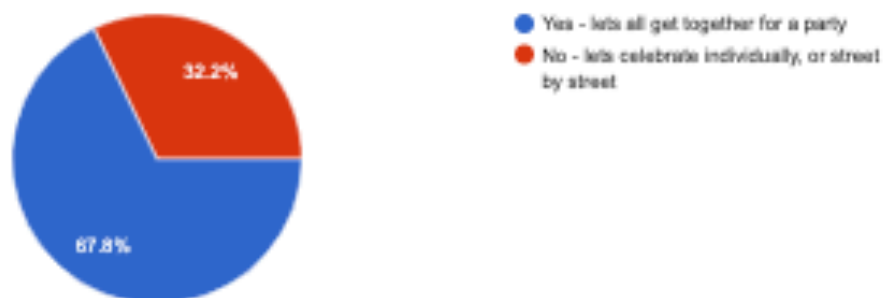

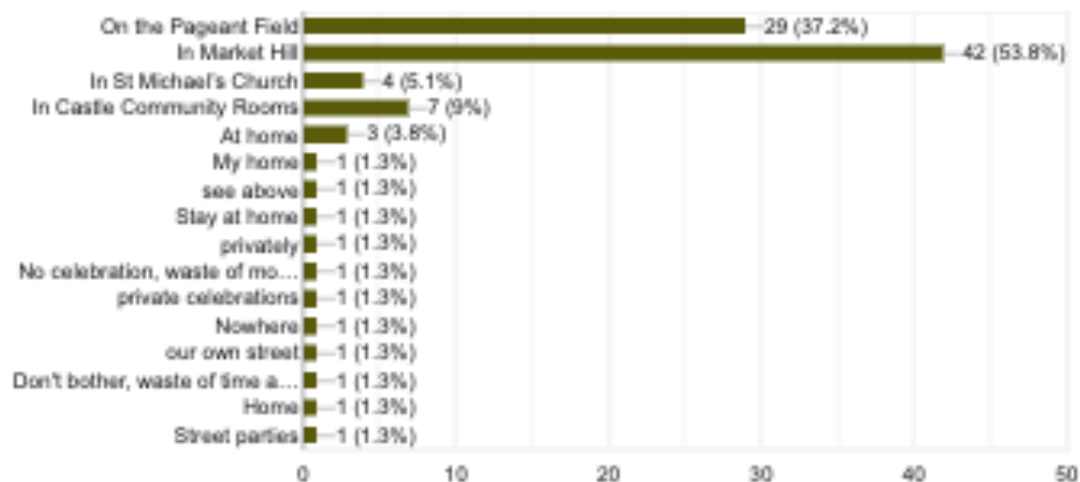

There are several options, the more expensive screen will mean tickets will cost more:

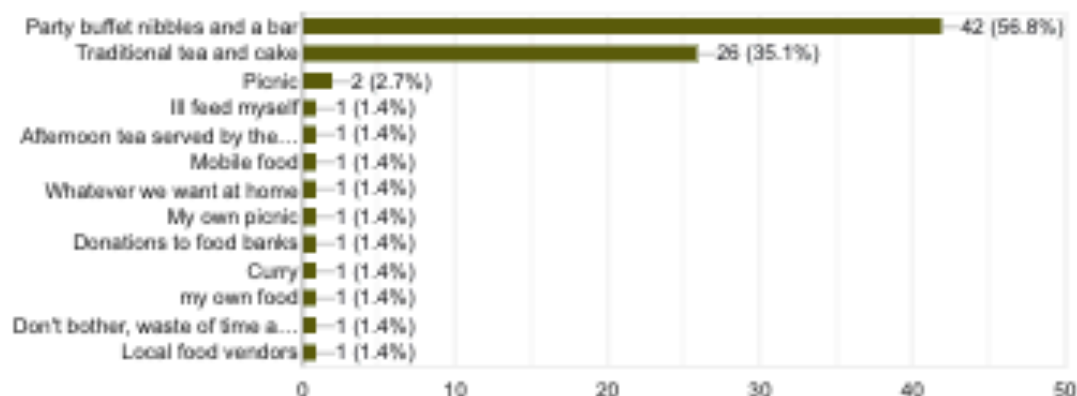

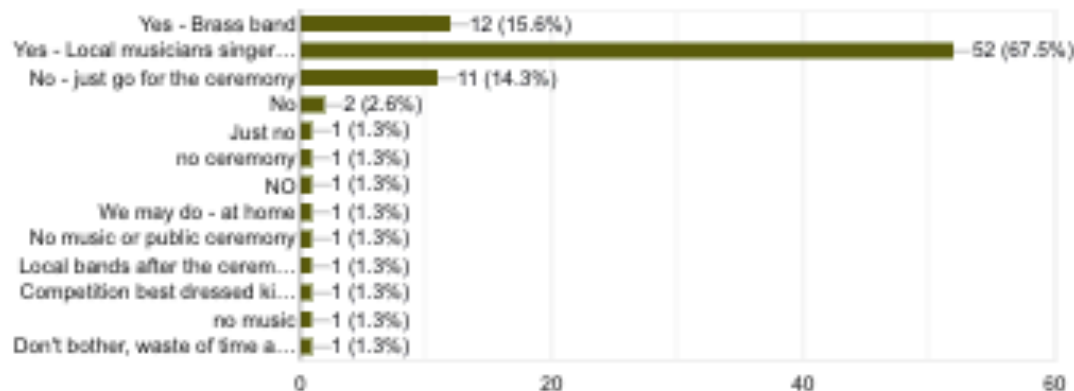
## What kind of food and drink?

## Do we need live music?

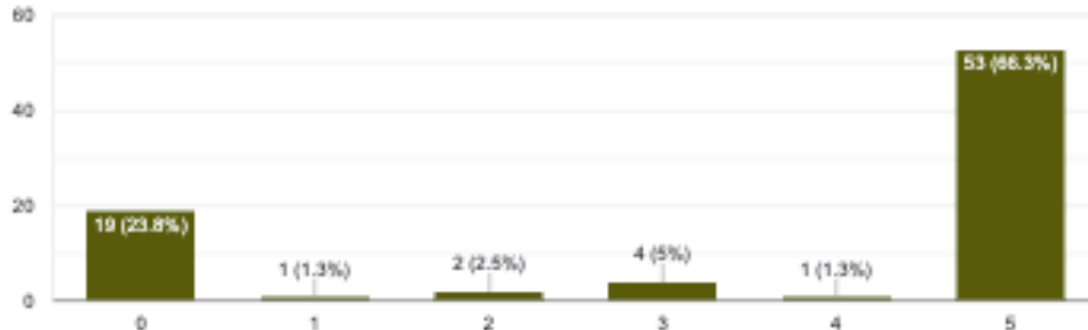
